Course Objectives:	The subject: Introduction to Civil Law includes the elaboration of civil law principles in general in the contemporary manner, which are fundamental for all other parts of civil law. Judicial institutions which are object of civil law in general, will be treated based upon the Kosovo positive law and in comparative civil law in continental system and common law. Lectures and seminars of this course will be held once a week for three hours. Teaching/ lectures will be organized within the first seminar of Bachelor studies. This course is compulsory. Students will have a chance to get theoretical and practical knowledge in matters of civil law.
Course Objectives.	The goals of the course consists in providing possibilities to the master studies –judicial-civil direction – to develop the awareness of students in implementation of provisions by which the judicial and civil matters are regulated. The students will have the opportunity, to solve the tasks which are required in the field of civil law by using logical and analytical approach. Students will develop skills for critical approach to law and legal argument in the field of civil law.
Learning outcomes:	The main outcomes of this course includes gaining of theoretical and practical knowledge in the field of civil law such as: which kind of legal relationships are governed by the civil law, subjects in civil relations,

legal capacity, ways of establishment of civil law relations, modification and similar topics. All these topics will be concretized and simulated with practical cases and examples during lectures and exercises with students.

### **Teaching Methodology:**

Contemporary Civil Law will be taught through lectures and seminars, exercises by not excluding the other possible varieties. The lecture will show presentation of the introductory basic rules and positive law of Kosova, as well as making comparisons in the comparative law of civil law institutions. Seminars will be an interactive process of learning for students, based on independent research of the subject by the students under the supervision of the course professor. The treatment of different examples will be aimed to facilitate the students in understanding the civil law. Through lectures and seminars students will be encouraged to have a critical approach toward law and court decisions through which matters in the area of civil law have been resolved. Students will be required to write at least one paper that related to the issues or topics addressed during the lectures. The written work

	will be calculated in the stud	ent's final evaluation.
